Irwin Scullin, 95, of Damascus, died Monday, Jan. 18, 2010.

He was born Dec. 24, 1914, in Austin, Minn.

He was employed as a branch manager with the Hormel Meat Packing Co. in Austin in his early years, followed by a 36-year career with the Boy Scouts of America, serving as scout executive in Huron, S.D., Huntington, W.Va., and Baltimore, regional executive in Philadelphia, Pa., and director of professional personnel services at the national Scout office in New Brunswick, N.J. After his retirement with the Boy Scouts, he became an entrepreneur, establishing Quail Hill Programs for attracting and feeding wild birds.

He excelled at creating opportunities for young people and service to his community.

He completed graduate studies at the University of Minnesota and the University of Chicago. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II. A longtime member of the Rotary Club, he served as past president of the Damascus club.

He is survived by a daughter, Nancy Neomany of Annapolis; a son, Dr. Roger Scullin of Damascus, a son, Charles Scullin of Reading, Pa., and their families.

He enjoyed playing the coronet, camping, photography and gardening.
